This will mean infant school staff will need to apply for posts in the primary school. The County Council will work with all affected staff and their professional associations to ensure the interests of all staff is fully considered.

3.1. Consultation took place between the 27th June and 1 August 2017. Dedicated webpages, containing information on the consultation process, together with letters containing information and the link to the consultation webpages were sent to parents of the schools concerned and all other schools within two miles, together with a range of other local and relevant stakeholders. Four drop-in sessions were held, two at each school and were attended by a mixed audience including parents, staff, governors and other interested parties

Whilst the infant school will close the junior school will extend its age range to cater for those pupils currently on roll in the infant school.
