What is an Equality Impact Assessment (EIA) and why does the County Council do them?

The [Public Sector Equality Duty](#) (PSED) is an obligation within the [Equality Act 2010](#) ("the Act"), which asks public authorities, like Hampshire County Council, to give 'due regard' to equality considerations, in particular to:

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation and other conduct prohibited by the Act.
- Advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not.
- Foster good relations between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not.

This includes assessing the impact of policies and practices on individuals and communities with a protected characteristic, as defined in the Act and some other specific groups. The County Council uses EIAs to ensure it has paid 'due regard' to equalities considerations when there are changes to a service or policy, a new project or certain decisions.

Service affected	Support provided to households through the Connect4Communities programme
Description of the service/policy/project/project phase	From September 2020, the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) provided funding to Local Authorities through the Covid Winter/Household Support Grant. The Household Support Grant is aimed at vulnerable families impacted by COVID, the reduction in universal credit and increased energy costs this winter to provide financial support for food and energy bills. Hampshire County Council (HCC) have worked with a wide variety of partners and other organisations and supported the development and delivery of a range of initiatives to support those most vulnerable.
New/changed service/policy/project	The DWP will provide a further £7.1m funding to HCC to support vulnerable households with costs of food, energy, water bills and housing costs between April - September 2022. The grant conditions state that at least 33% must be spent on households with children, at least 33% must be spent on pensioners and the remaining 33% can be spent on other types of households. Working with schools, colleges and early years providers the proposed programme will deliver food vouchers and other financial support to a wide range of vulnerable families between April and September 2022. Through the grant funding, the programme will also support the development and delivery of a range of community led projects and holiday activity and food schemes to meet local needs across Hampshire. A variety of initiatives have been identified working with our local community partners.

Engagement
<p>Stakeholder engagement we sought via email and through meetings from major stakeholders including the voluntary and charitable sector, Adult Health & Care, Local Children's Partnerships, Supporting Families, Children's Social Care, Early Years, County Supplies & HC3S, Community Pantry operators and Communications. A variety of other stakeholders have been consulted so existing local provision and need could be identified and minimise risks in respect of funding duplication.</p>
