



Enlargement of South Baddesley Primary School (June 2018)

Description of current service/policy

To make a prescribed alteration to SOUTH BADDESLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL, South Baddesley, Lymington, SO41 5RP (category of schools – Controlled C of E) by enlarging the premises of the school.

Geographical impact: New
Forest

Description of proposed change

The proposed change is to increase the capacity of South Baddesley Primary School to allow them to offer 22 places for Year R (age 4+). This expansion will allow the school to increase its capacity from 112 to 156 pupils in total. i.e. 22 pupils per year group.

In order to accommodate the additional proposed pupils the school has created two new classrooms.

Engagement and consultation

Has engagement or consultation been carried out? Yes

A formal consultation took place between 2 February and 9 March 2018, and a drop-in session was held at the school on 21 February 2018.

This consultation received a total of 8 written comments which were largely focused around the impact on pupil numbers at other local schools.

A Public Notice was published and displayed from 18 May to 22 June 2018. No comments or objections were received during this period.

In considering the responses received from the consultation and public notice period, the County Council felt that the provision of additional school places should be supported.
