Description of current service/policy

Hampshire County Council has previously subsidised the use of the West Berkshire HWRC that is nearer to around 5,000 households than a Hampshire facility. In 2020, the decision was taken to terminate the agreement as budget pressures meant the County Council could no longer fund it. Following the decision, an interim arrangement was agreed where Hampshire County Council and Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council would jointly subsidise the use of the site for relevant Hampshire residents for a further 12 months while discussions continued into alternative options.

Description of proposed change

West Berkshire Council is considering plans for a nominal entry charge for non-Berkshire residents which would enable local residents to continue using the site, but not at the cost of wider Hampshire householders.
