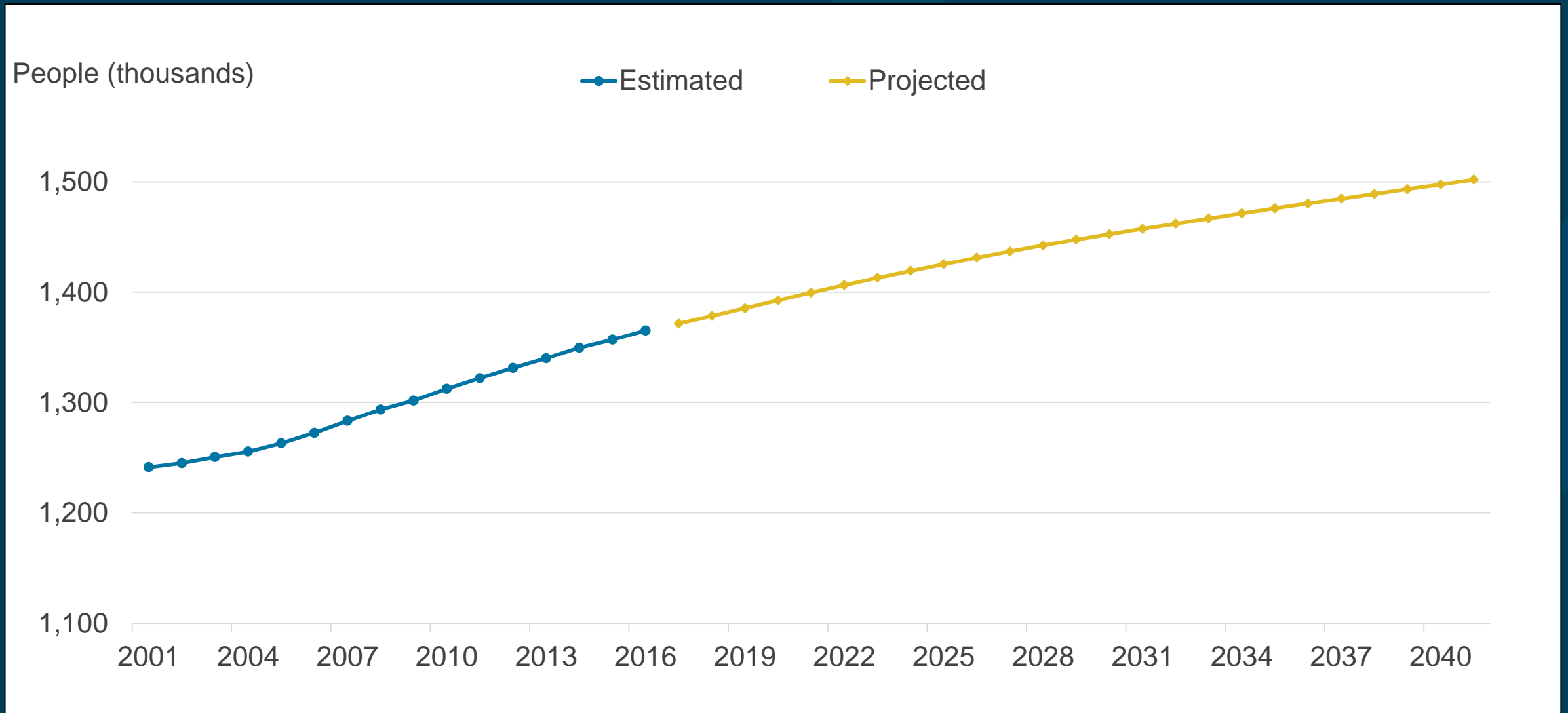

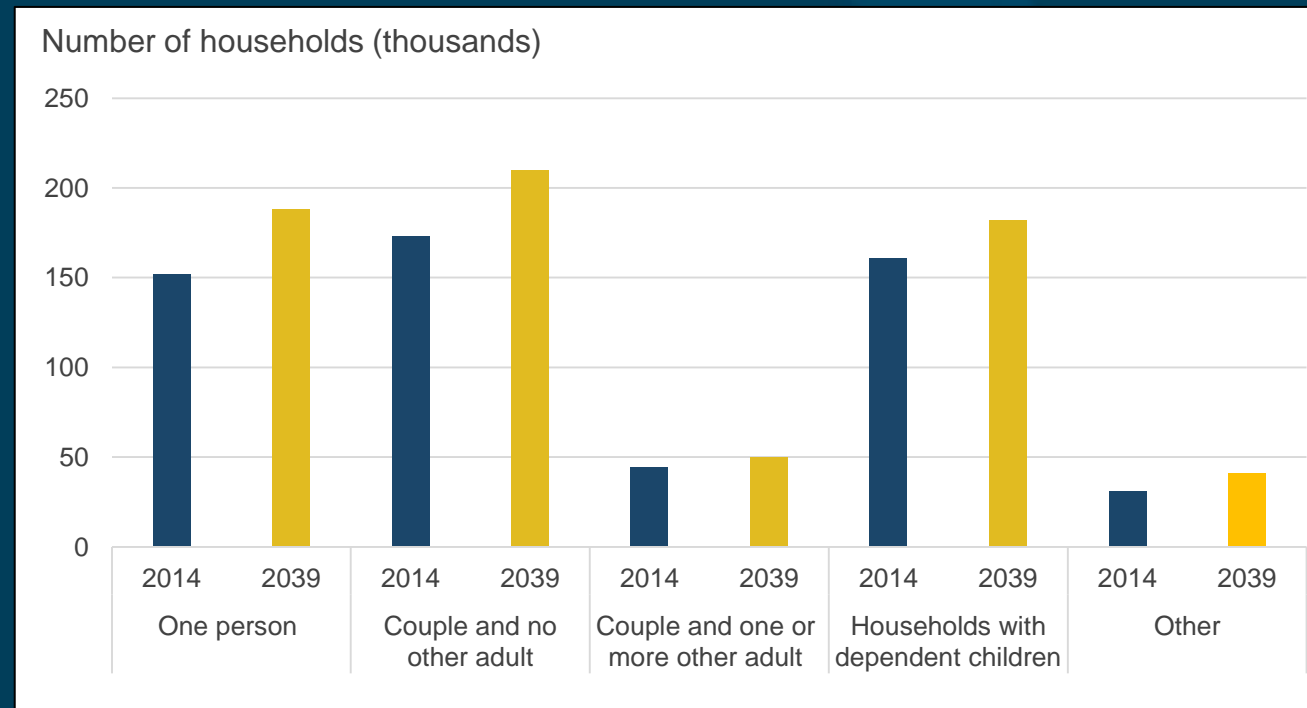

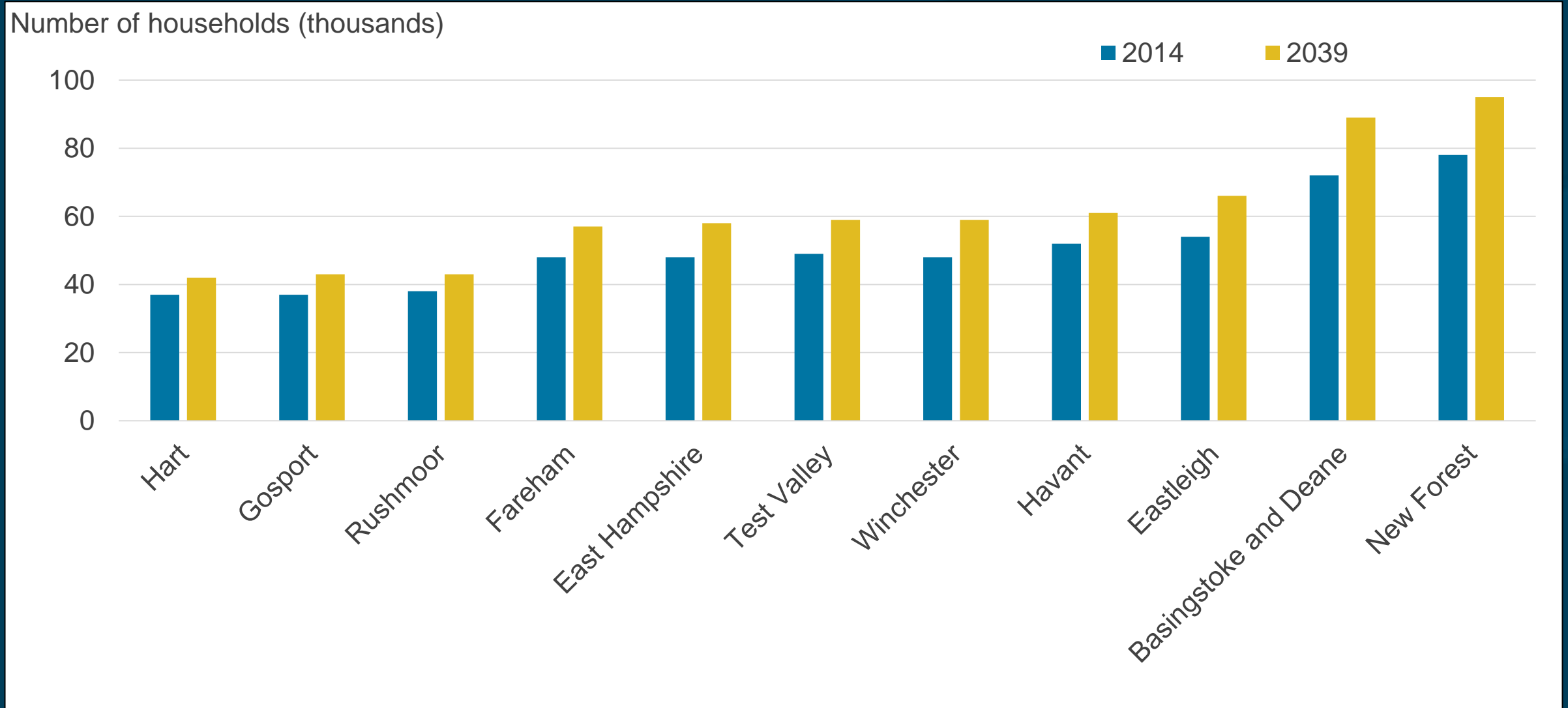

# The *demographic balancing equation*

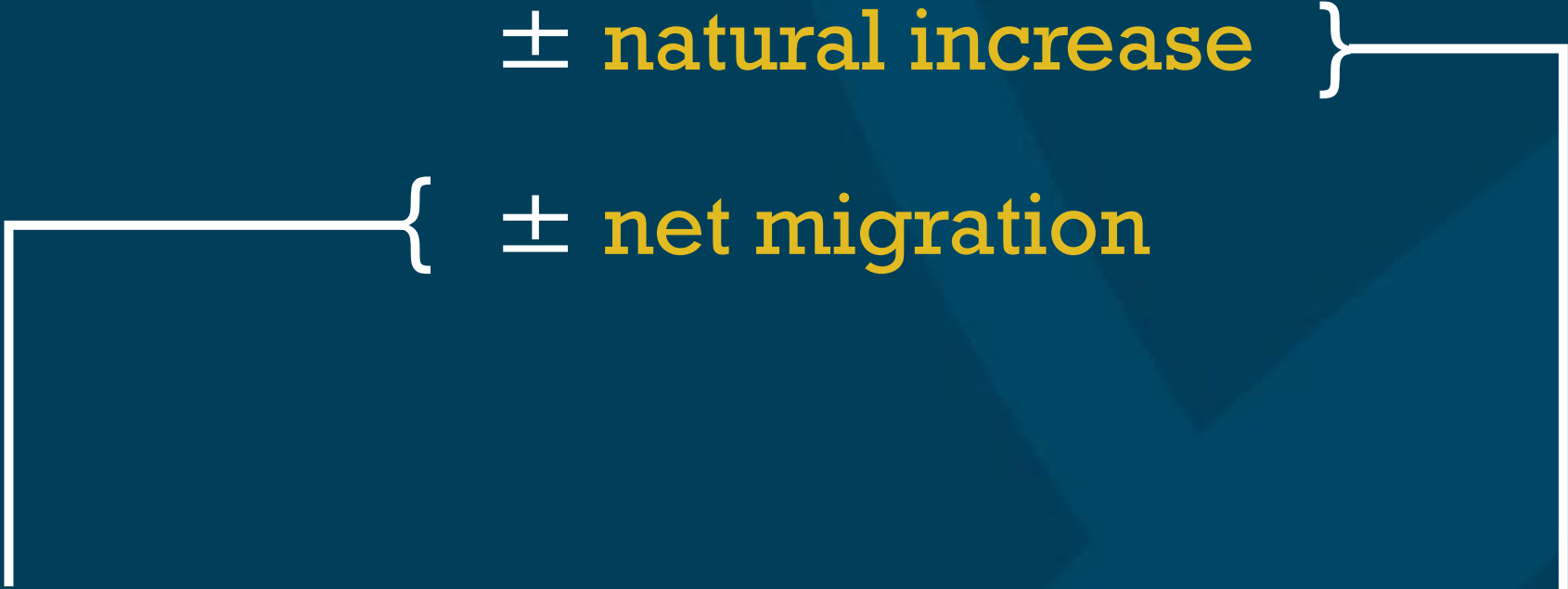
Total population = Start population

± natural increase

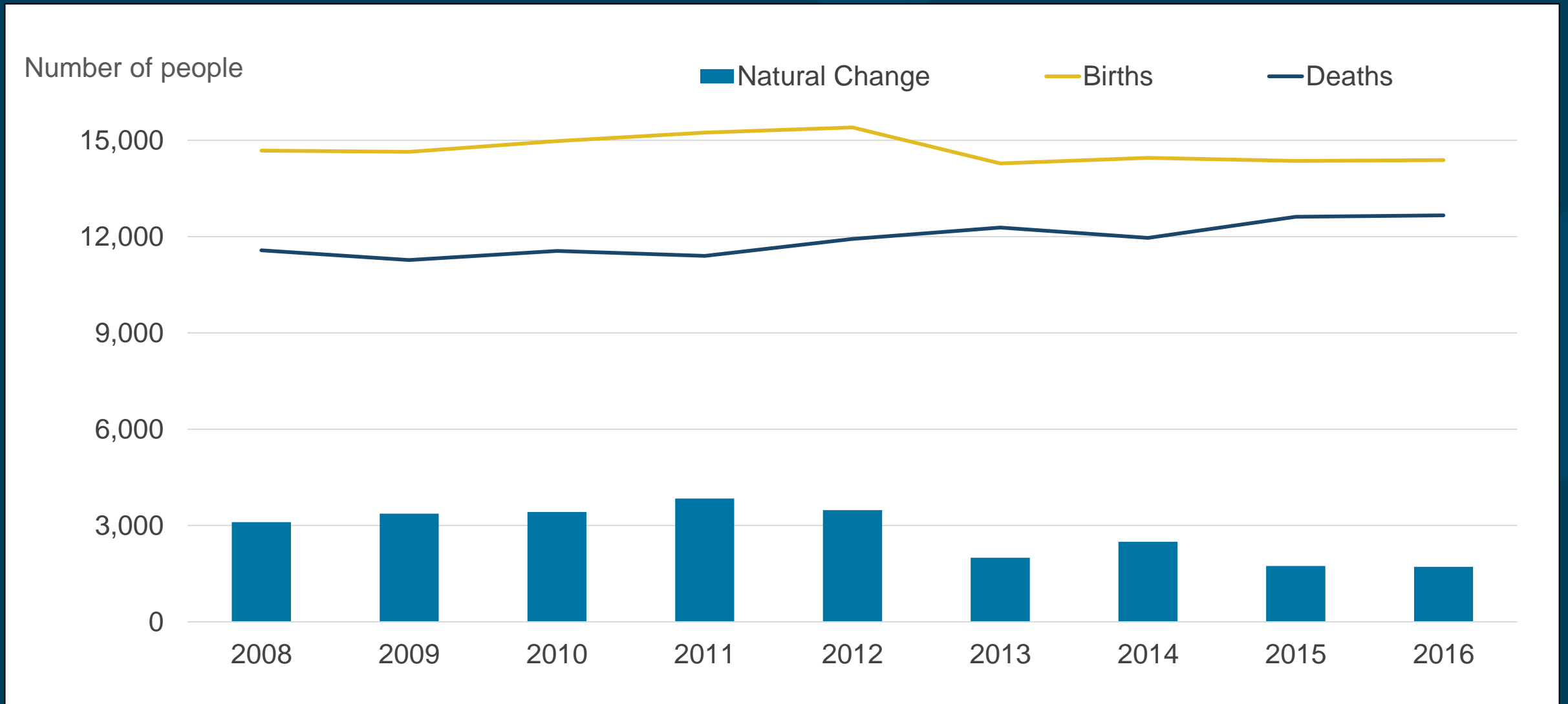
± net migration

Contributions from both *internal* and *international* immigration



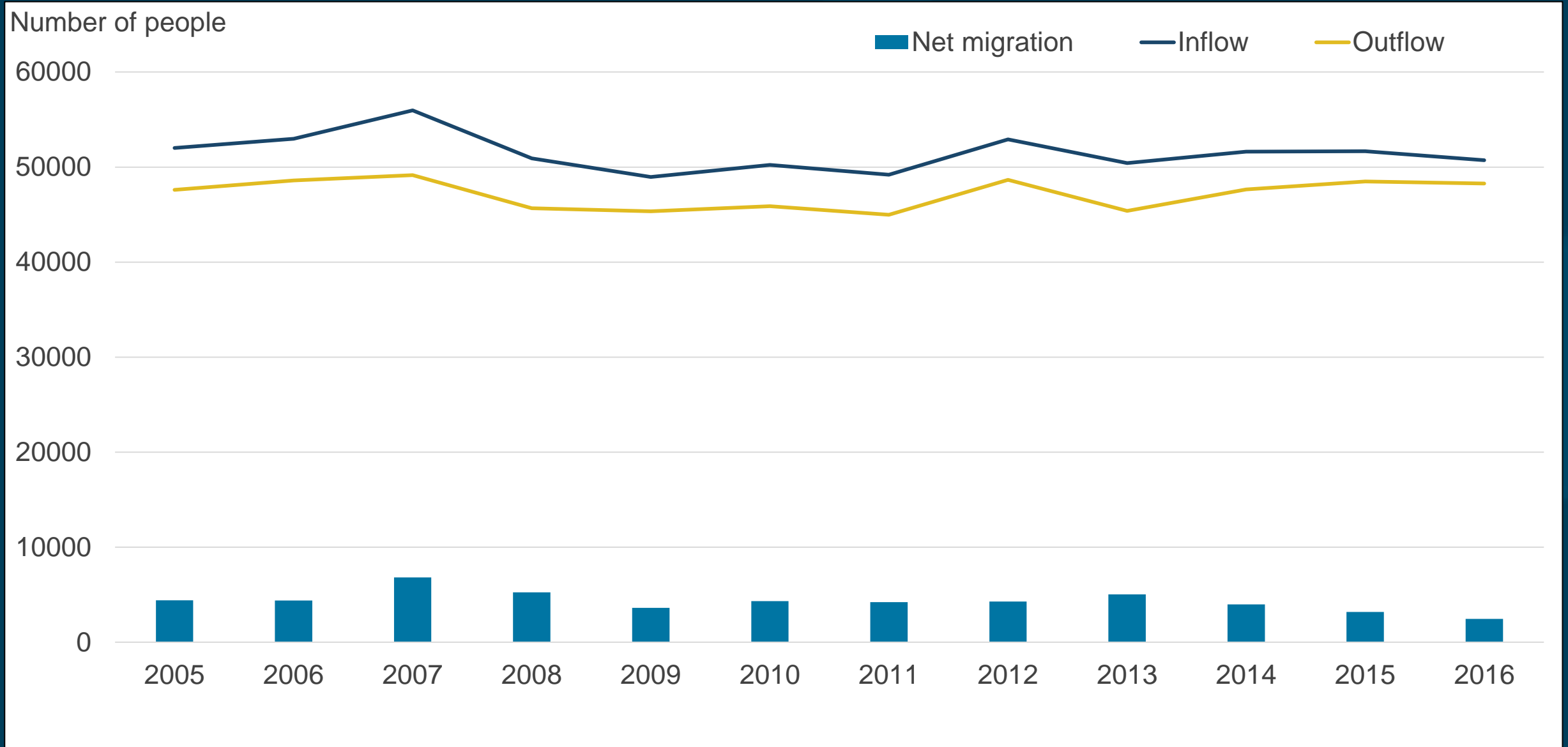

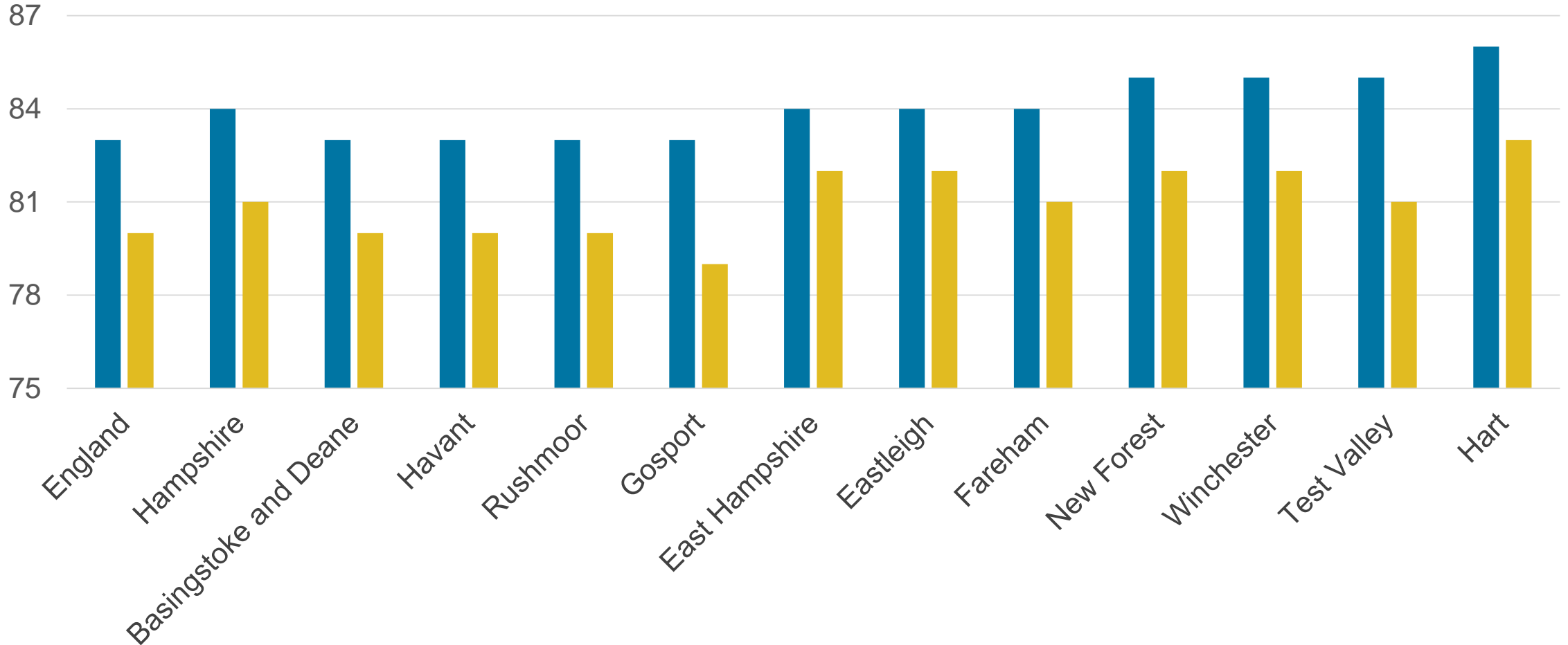

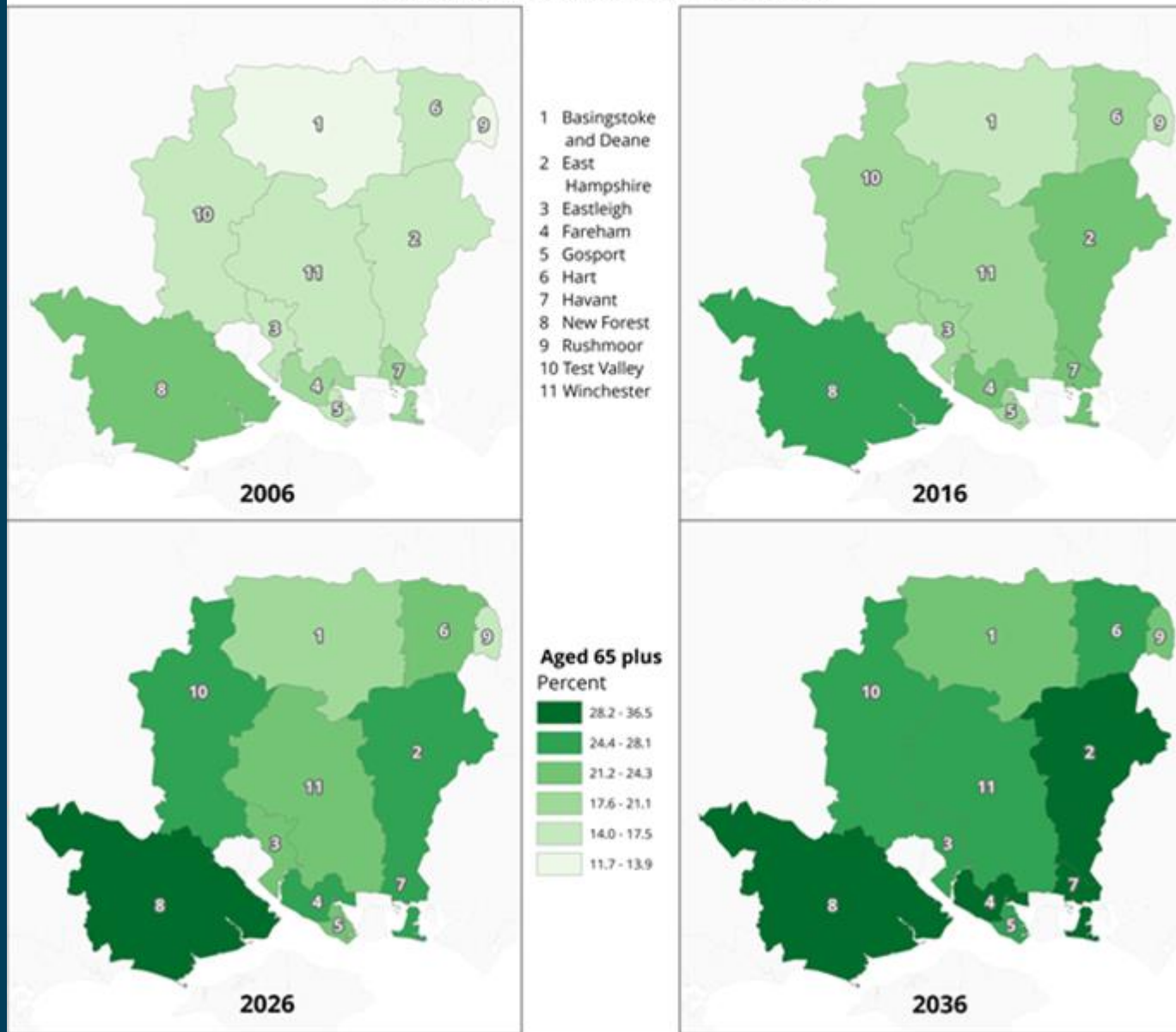
