What is the Priority.

Opportunity.

- Better Coordination of delivery

- Do we need area-based infrastructure plans for our area. We've got Planning Authorities / Local Plans transport plans, got digital plans, but is there a single infrastructure plan, Transport Plan
- Joint up – better chance to come together (collective voice)
