### Population projections assumptions:

The subnational population projections (SNPPs) are produced every two years with new assumptions based on the most recently available data. The latest subnational projections supersede the previous set. The differences seen between the two sets of projections can be explained by:

1. A reduction in assumed mortality improvements in the 2016-based National population projections (NPPs); the number of deaths are constrained to match the principal projection for England for every year in the projection.
2. A reduction in long-term fertility assumptions in the 2016-based NPPs; as with deaths, the number of births at subnational level are constrained to the NPPs.
3. A reduction in the long-term international migration assumption in the 2016-based NPP; like births and deaths, net migration is also constrained to the NPPs.
4. The data used to set local level assumptions; the 2016-based SNPPs use data from mid-2012 to mid-2016 to calculate local level age specific fertility and mortality rates. The previous set of SNPPs (2014-based) used data between mid-2010 and mid-2014.
5. The base population for the 2016-based SNPPs are the revised mid-2016 population estimates, which is different from the mid-2014 population estimates used in the previous set of projections.

It is advisable to use the latest set of projections available (2016-based) when undertaking analysis as these are produced using the latest input data available.
