

# HAMPSHIRE VILLAGE SURVEY

NAME Charlton  
PARISH Charlton  
HUNDRED Andover  
DISTRICT Test Valley

GEOLOGY River gravels and upper chalk

**SITE CONTEXT** The core of the village lies in a small dry valley at around 70-80m OD with spurs to the W and E which reach a height of over 90m OD. Along the S limit of the village is a small stream which has several lakes along its course near to the settlement.

**PLAN TYPE & DESCRIPTION** Regular row

Within the angle formed by the roads to the N and W there are two blocks of properties, one along the N road and one along the W road. The latter contains only two properties although it is divided into several strips, some narrow. The block along the n road is also divided into strips and is more heavily occupied with only two plots unoccupied.

Along the E side of the N road and at the N end of the village is a row of properties with a slightly curving rear boundary. The plots are much shorter than the ploits on the W side of the road. S of this unit the plots become less regular in shape and size and some have irregular sub-division.

S of the winding road to the NE is a block which has narrow but unequal divisions and an irregular S boundary. S of this unit and on the W side of the wider part of the N-S road the plots are irregular and appear more haphazard. Near the stream at the S end of the village and to the E of the road a couple of houses are aligned with the stream with a small green between.

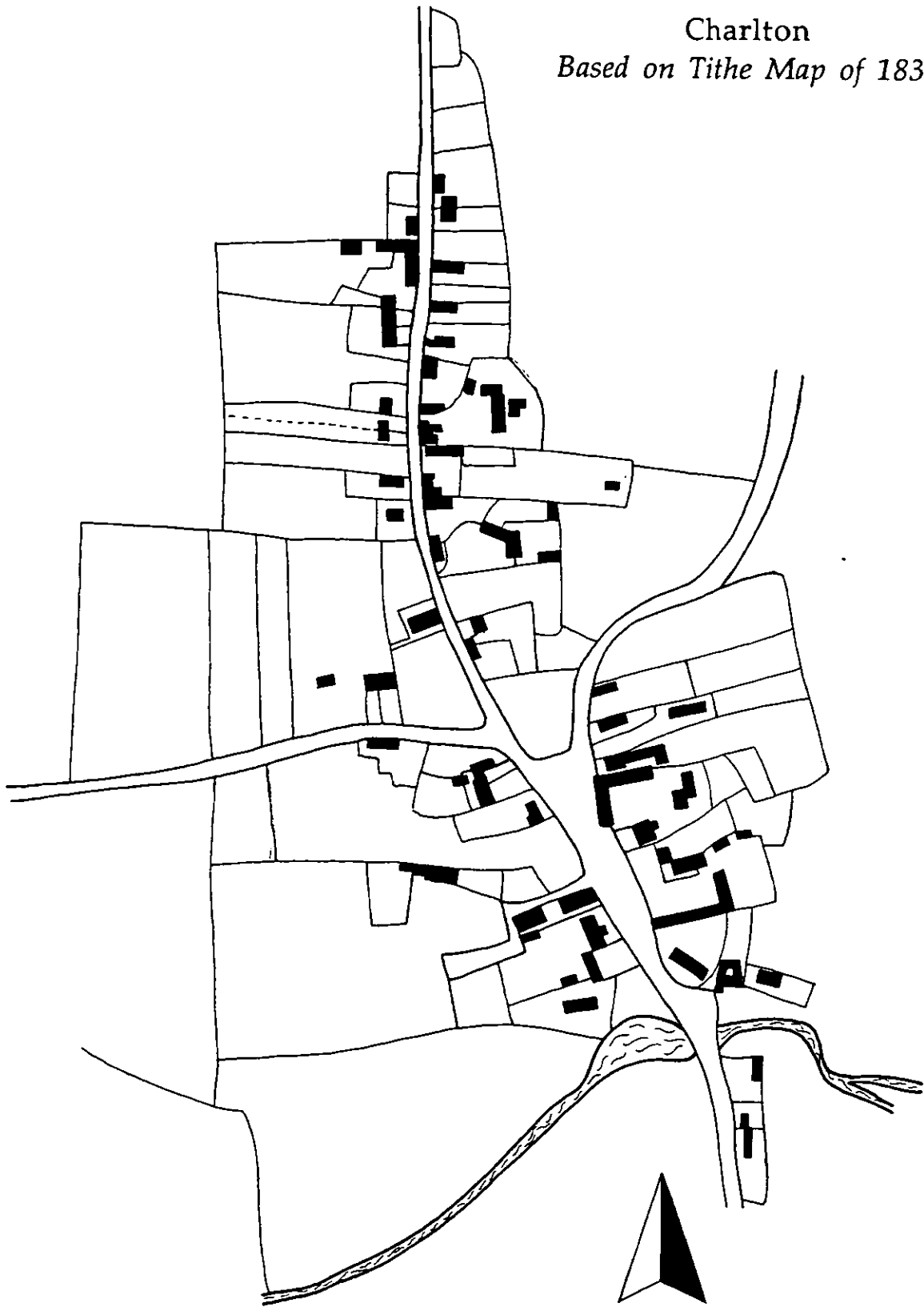

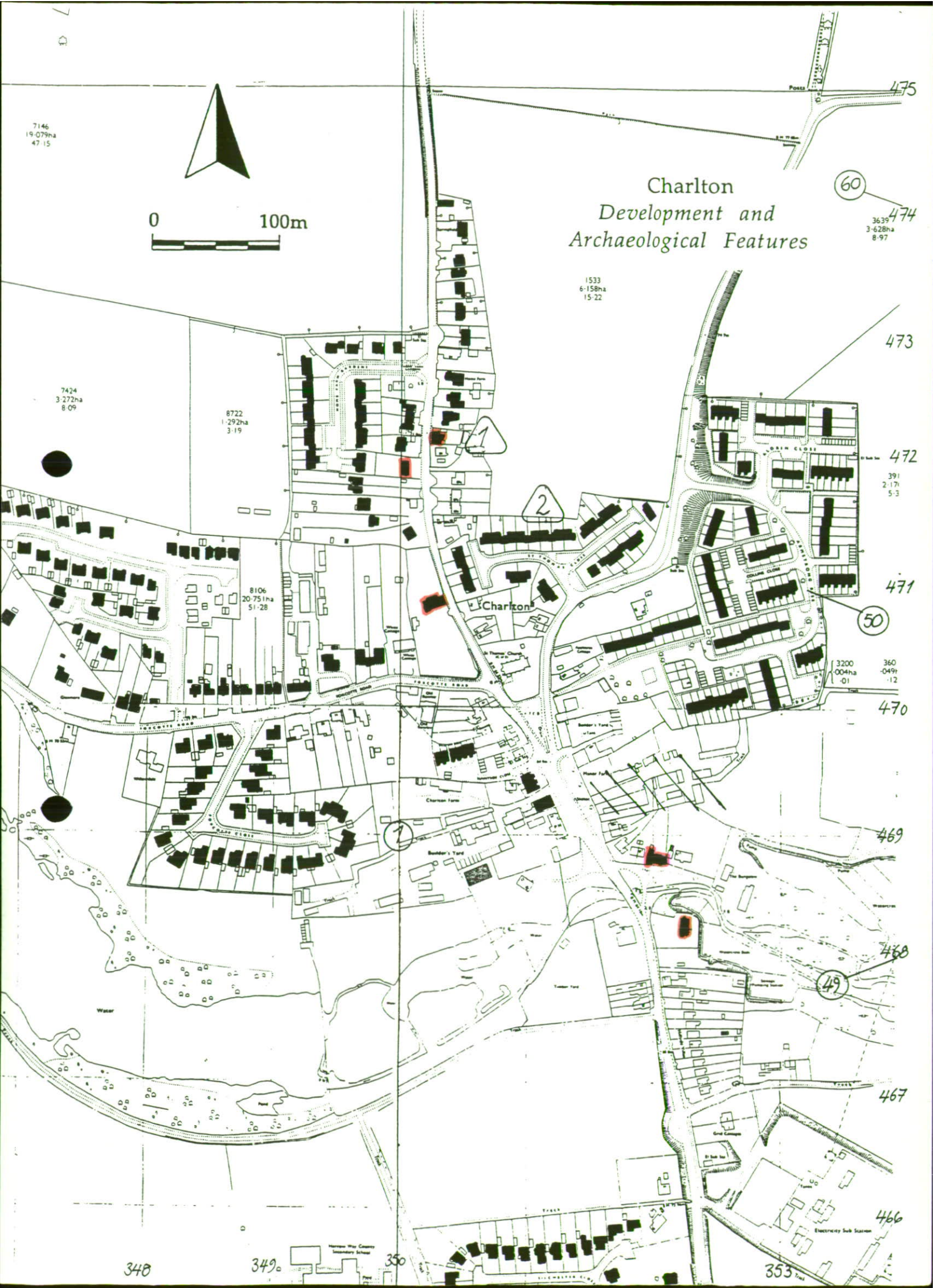
