GEOLOGY Plateau Gravels and Osborne and Headon Beds

SITE CONTEXT East Boldre is a linear settlement some 4km long lying on relatively flat land with gentle undulations. At the N end of the settlement it lies at around 40m OD and gradually declines in height to the S until East End which lies at 17m OD. Several streams rise near the settlement or run through it, some feeding Crockford Stream to the W.

PLAN TYPE & DESCRIPTION Common edge.

East Boldre consists of settlement ranged along the edge of Beaulieu Heath for up to 4km. The settlement is almost entirely on the E side of the road which marks the E line of the Heath but there are a few cottages and closes which are evident encroachments onto the heathland. The settlement would originally have consisted of occasional cottages with fairly large spaces between occupied areas but most of the spaces between the older properties that survive have been developed, mostly in the latter part of the C19 and C20.

AREAS OF ARCHAEOLOGICAL POTENTIAL There are no particular AAP or AHAPs due to the dispersed nature of the settlement and the fact that most of the spaces between the older elements of the settlement have been infilled by late C19 and modern development. Although no AAPs have been identified, development within any of the unfilled gaps or around the older buildings should be monitored as the development of such settlements is as yet not clearly understood.

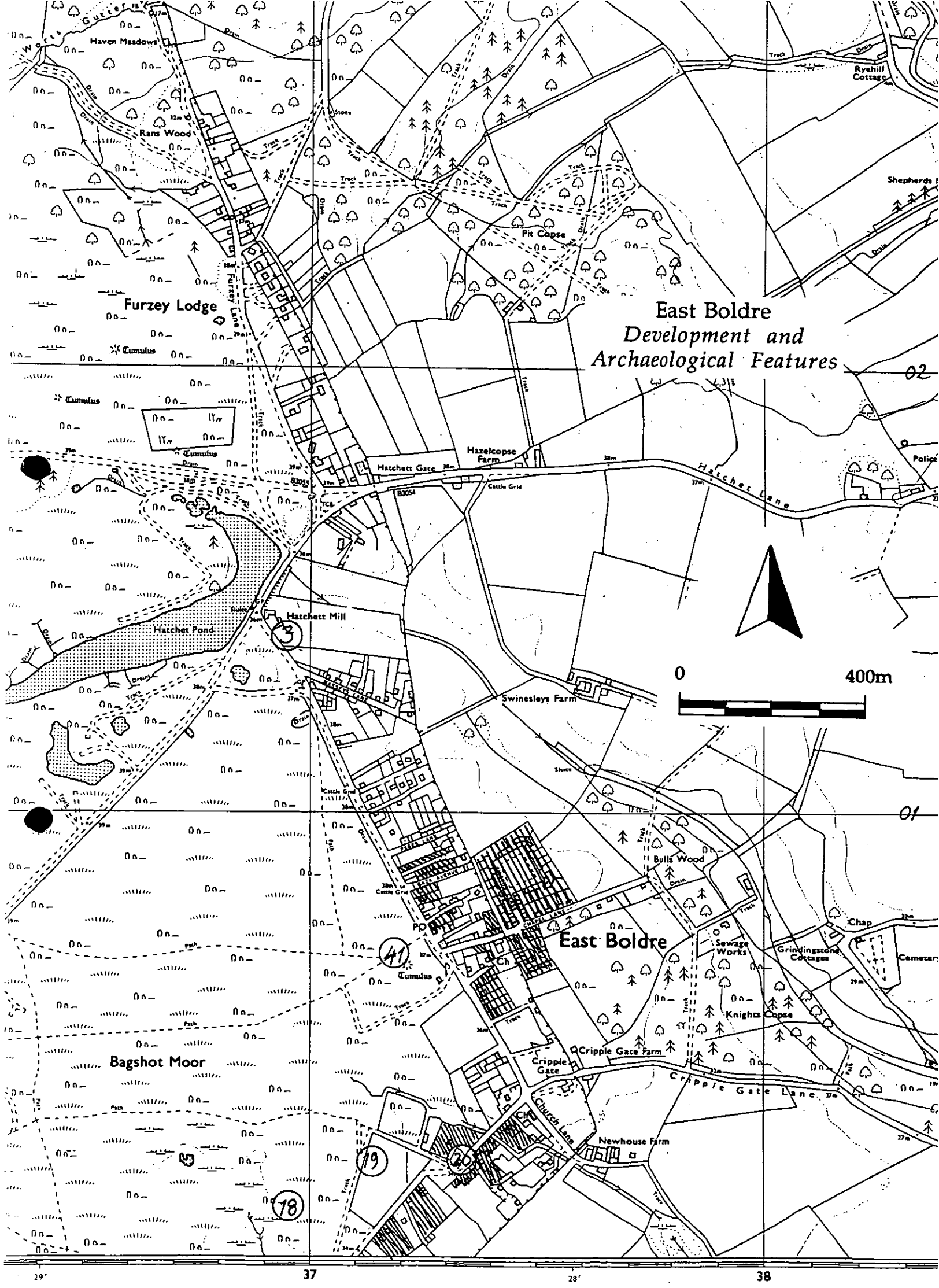

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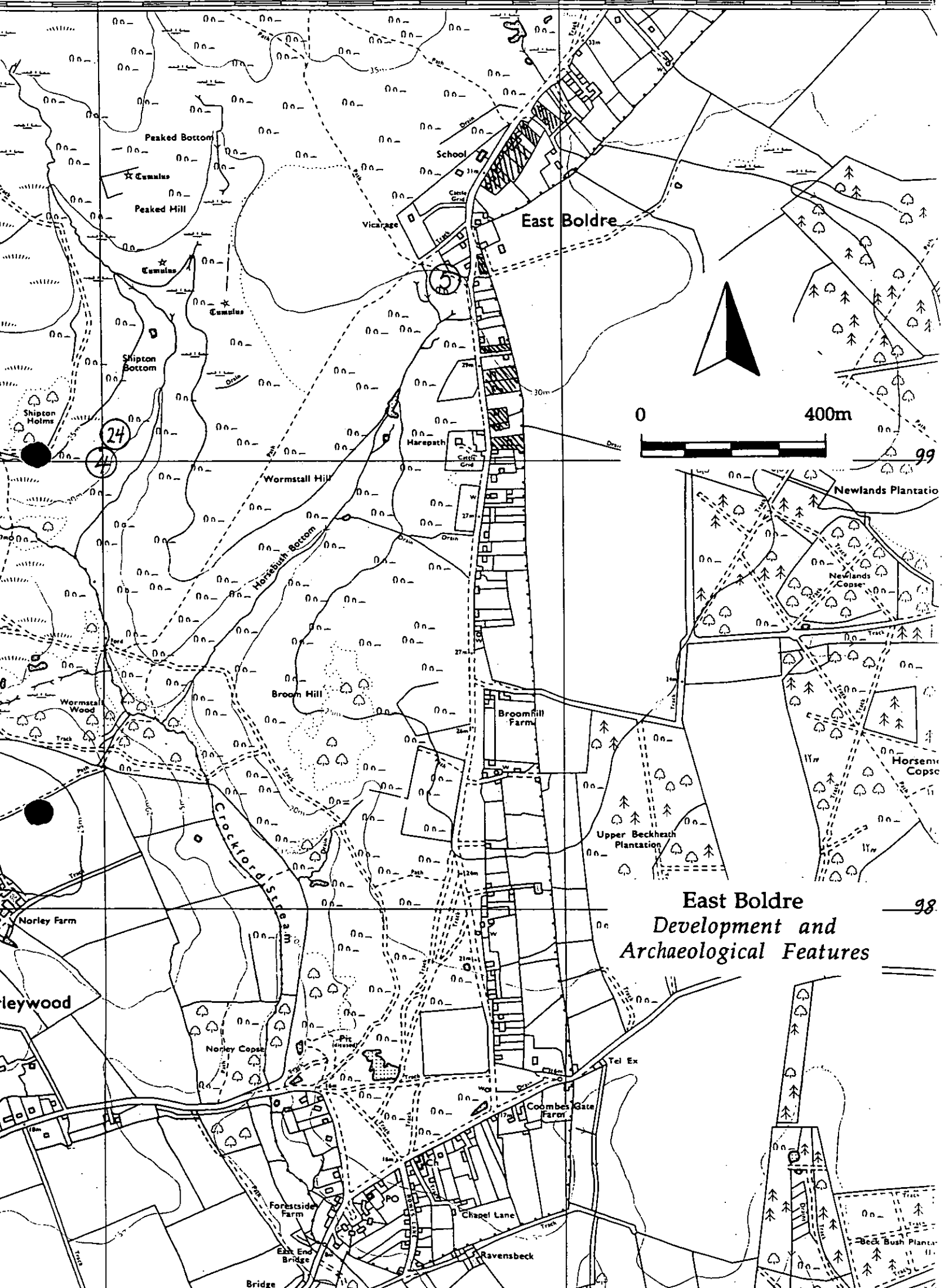
