

NAME Nutley
PARISH Nutley
HUNDRED Bermondspit
DISTRICT Basingstoke and Deane
NGR SU 610445
GEOLOGY Upper Chalk, Bracklesham Beds to the E and W.

SITE CONTEXT The settlement lies in a dry valley at 140m OD at the point where the main valley is joined by a 'tributary valley', also dry. The sides of the valley rise steeply to both the W and E of the settlement to 160-170m OD.

PLAN TYPE & DESCRIPTION Irregular agglomeration.

The church and Manor Farm lie on the W side of the road with the church in a roughly square churchyard. At this point the road through the settlement 'dog-legs' to the S. On the E side of the road there are some farm buildings and a couple of cottages in irregular plots. Almost 300m S of the core of the settlement, a cottage lies in the fork between two roads.

AREAS OF ARCHAEOLOGICAL POTENTIAL

An AHAP surrounds the church site, Manor Farm and the earthworks and cottage on the E side of the road. The SMR records that Nutley is a possible DMV. However, Axford, which also lies within this parish was not separately recorded in any of the taxation returns used in this survey and so using these sources as a guide to settlement size must take this into consideration. To cover the possibility that there has been some shrinkage on the edge of the present day hamlet, an AAP has been included to cover the area around the Manor Farm and alongside the roads through the settlement.

CHURCH & CHURCHYARD The church has been pulled down.

The churchyard is almost square and is quite overgrown with many of the gravestones obscured.

PRIMARY HISTORIC SOURCES

Domesday Henry the Treasurer. 4 free men held it from King Edward in freehold. Then it answered for 5 hides; now for 2.5 hides. Land for 5 pl. In lorship 3 pl; 4 villagers and 7 smallholders with 1.5 pl. 8 slaves. Value before 1066, 100s; later 60s; now £4 10s.

Geoffrey the Marshall holds 0.5 hide of this manor which belongs there so the Hundred states.

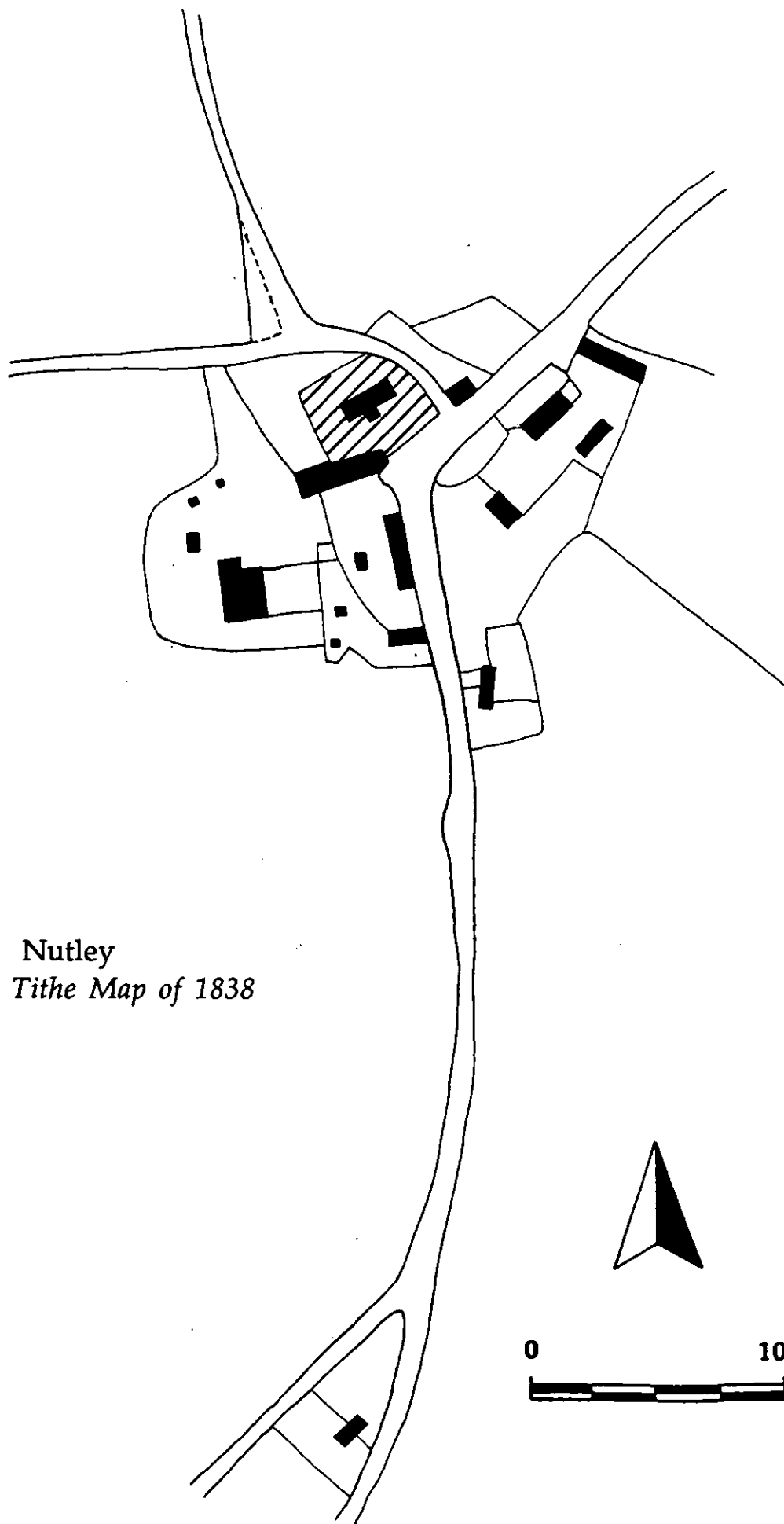

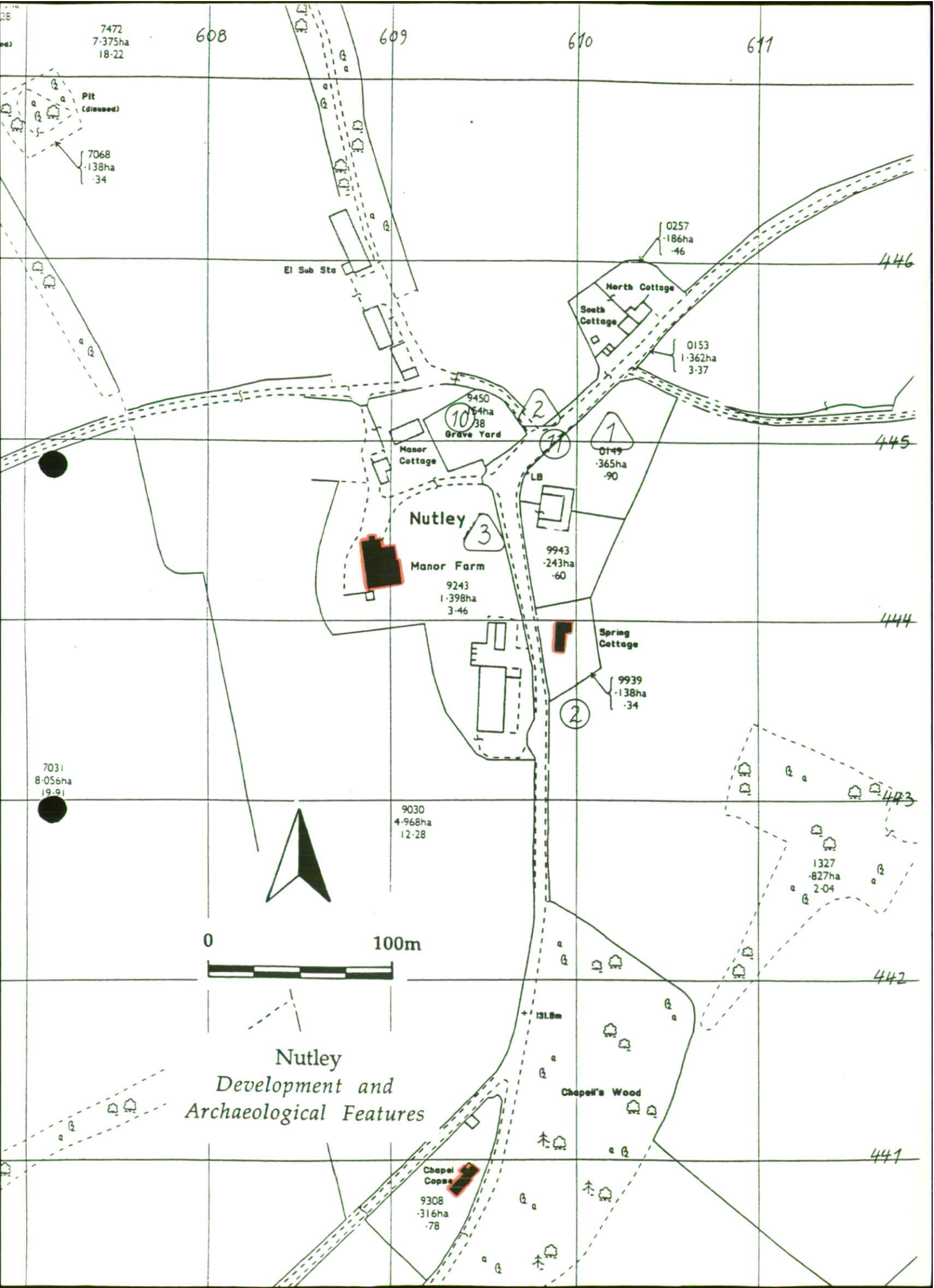

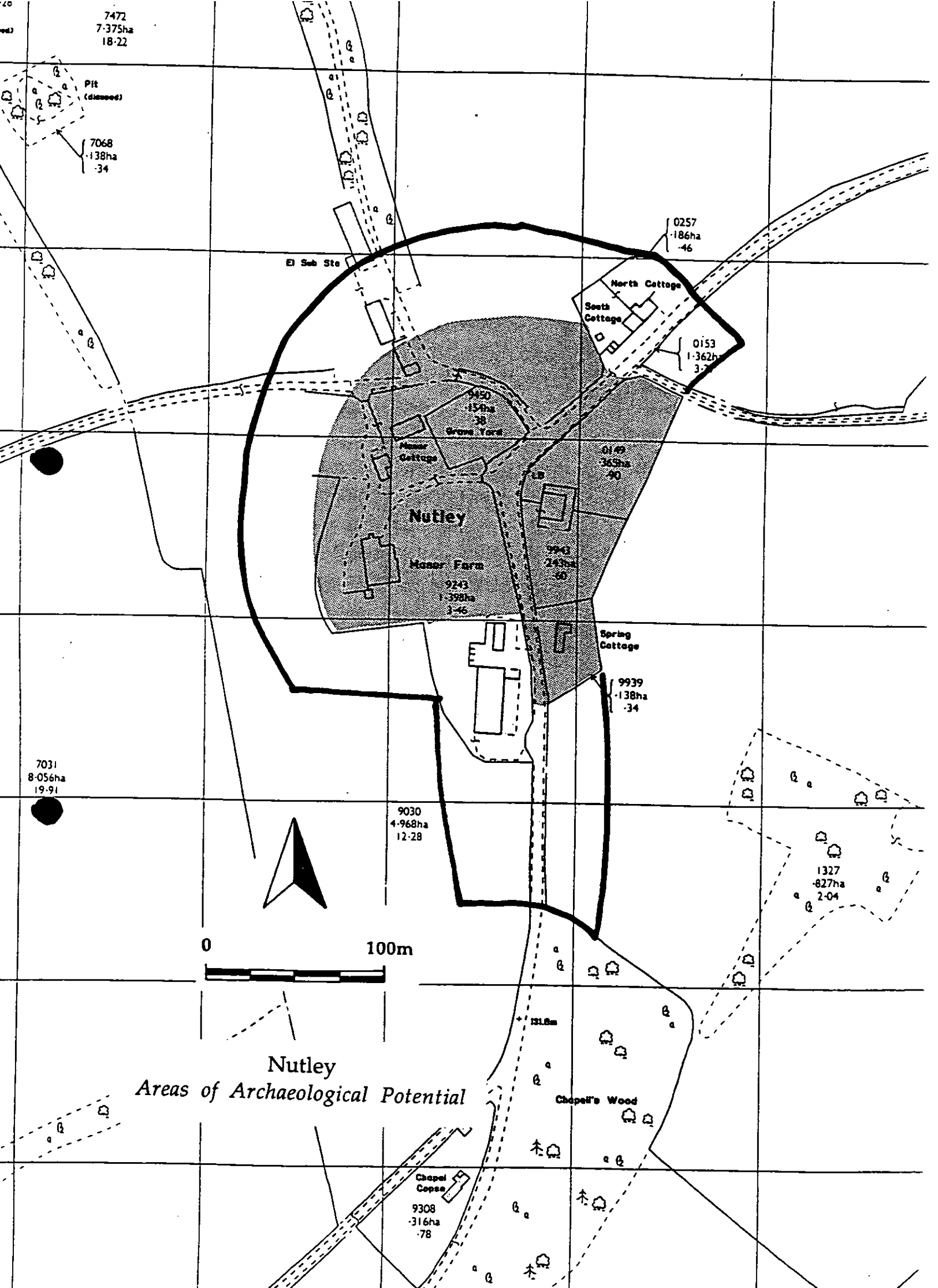
