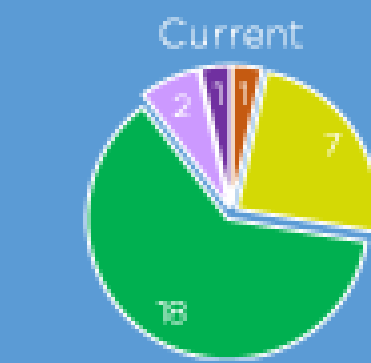

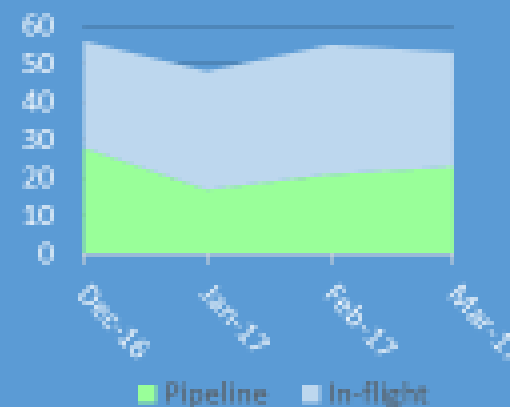
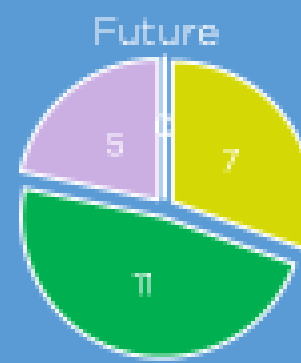
In-flight project status



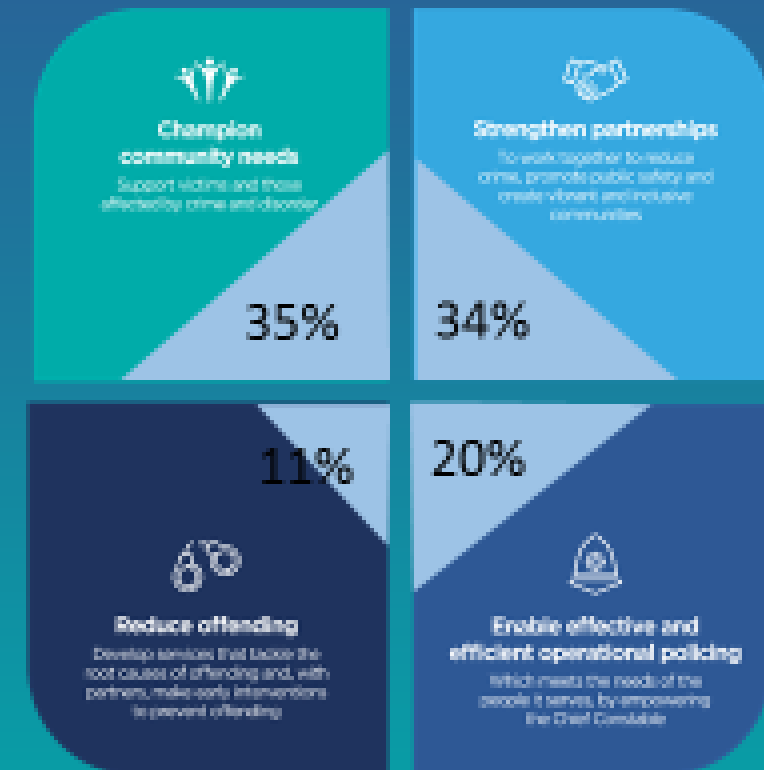

# COMMISSIONING GRANTS ROUND

The purpose of the Commissioner's Safer Communities Fund is to help prevent offending and support victims, assisting people to realise their life potential without being drawn into the Criminal Justice System. In this funding round the Commissioner received 148 applications totalling £4,649,936, exceeding by far the amount of funding available

# DOMESTIC HOMICIDE REVIEW

In the event of a domestic homicide, the police inform the relevant community safety partnership (CSP) who have responsibility for establishing a Domestic Homicide Review (DHR). A number of issues were raised by Community Safety Managers about Domestic Homicide Reviews, and so the purpose of the review was to address those issues in order to make improvements.

Issues which were addressed in the review are:

- Delay in DHRs being completed
- No budget
- Who to contact in a DHR
- Poor quality chairs
- Issues around contact with the family

As a result of the review, a number of recommendations have been made. This review improves 'the process' which enables professionals to work more effectively together. The review helps strengthen the foundations of the DHR process, which in turn identifies 'lessons to be learnt' to help keep people safer i.e. to reduce domestic homicides.

## COMPASS

COMPASS sessions form part of a tiered approach to scrutiny adopted by the PCC to hold the Chief Constable to account. The sessions are held on a quarterly basis in different parts of the Hampshire Policing Area. The public are asked to register their attendance in advance and are encouraged to submit their questions also in advance of the meeting, which is filmed and published on the PCC's website.

The current format sees the session split into two halves. During the first half the Chief Constable is scrutinised and asked questions by the PCC. The second half of the meeting is opened up to the audience who can ask questions of either the PCC or Chief Constable.
