Dear Hampshire Services,

Thank you for your letter dated 9th June 2017 requesting the comments of the Holyport Residents Association for the subject consultation.

Our comments are as follows;

The Holyport Residents Association objects to and deplors any traffic through Holyport on the A330, Moneyrow Green, Holyport Road, or on the A308 Windsor Road arising from Mineral Extraction or Waste Transport or from Fracking and requests that no such traffic travels on these roads.

In Maidenhead we are currently facing, by the year 2033, due to pressure from Central Government, the imposition through the Borough Local Development Plan of 14,240 homes and the additional traffic that will be imposed by the associated building work and subsequent occupation by new residents and their families.

Further, if the third runway at Heathrow goes ahead, we expect more traffic

due to people travelling to and from Heathrow and in addition the new homes that will have to be built to accommodate the suggested new workforce and their families. We also expect increased traffic from the Cross Rail project.

Additionally there are large housing developments to the East of Bracknell, which will also result in increased traffic here, from those who travel on the M4 Eastwards and return.

We request that the Central and Eastern Berkshire Authorities running the subject consultation make representations to Central Government requesting that they create a new M4 motorway Junction between the current J8/9 and J10, with suitable feeder roads to both sides of the M4. Such a junction is well overdue and would take some pressure off the A308, A330 and associated roads local to M4 J8/9 and give alternative routes for Minerals and Waste transport and for expected increased traffic due to the aforementioned matters.
