### Benefits for schools

  - Understand how pupils feel about school, friendships, health, and emotional wellbeing, and how your school can celebrate and improve its provision.

  - Your anonymous data helps improve support for children, young people, and families across Hampshire.

  - Use findings to inform school improvement, PSHE, and pastoral care.
