The list below gives a flavour of some of the partnership's successes over the last year.

- New Children and Young People working group established.
- New data dashboard created.
- Two successful communications campaigns delivered (Christmas and Valentine's Day).
- White Ribbon Day and the 16 Days of Action marked, including partnership wide awareness raising and training.
- Funding secured and specifications developed for five new areas of training, as identified via a training needs analysis
- Ongoing high-quality training delivered in partnership with the Hampshire Safeguarding Children's Board Wednesday Webinar programme – available to all sectors free of charge.
- Links and relationships strengthened with a variety of areas, including the Hampshire Safeguarding Adults Board, HIES, Regional Diverse Communities Network, etc.
- Domestic Homicide Review (DHR) work developed, including more structured and close working relationships with the OPCC and local Community Safety Partnerships, and development of the local Hampshire DHR Best Practice Guidance and resource pack.
- 10-25 year olds research completed, with recommendations delivered to HDAP and incorporated into the strategic action plan.
- The Authentic Voice contract commissioned with Safelives and first phase (mapping) delivered.
- Family and Friends network established by Stop Domestic Abuse.
