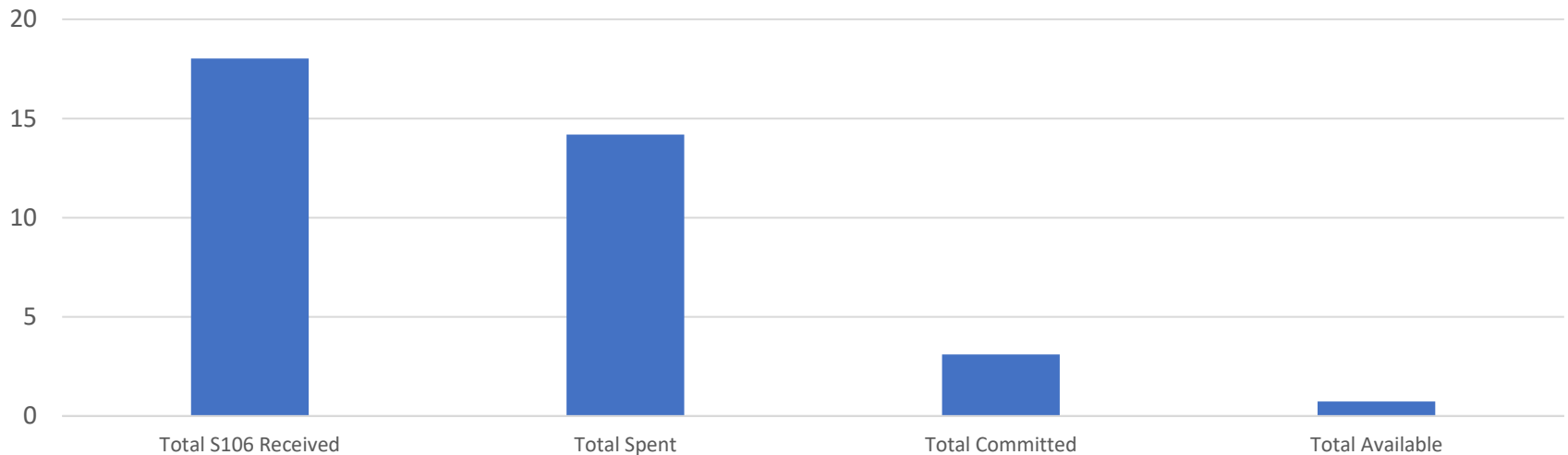


Whitehill and Bordon Transport Funding Summary June 2026

S106 Overview June 2026



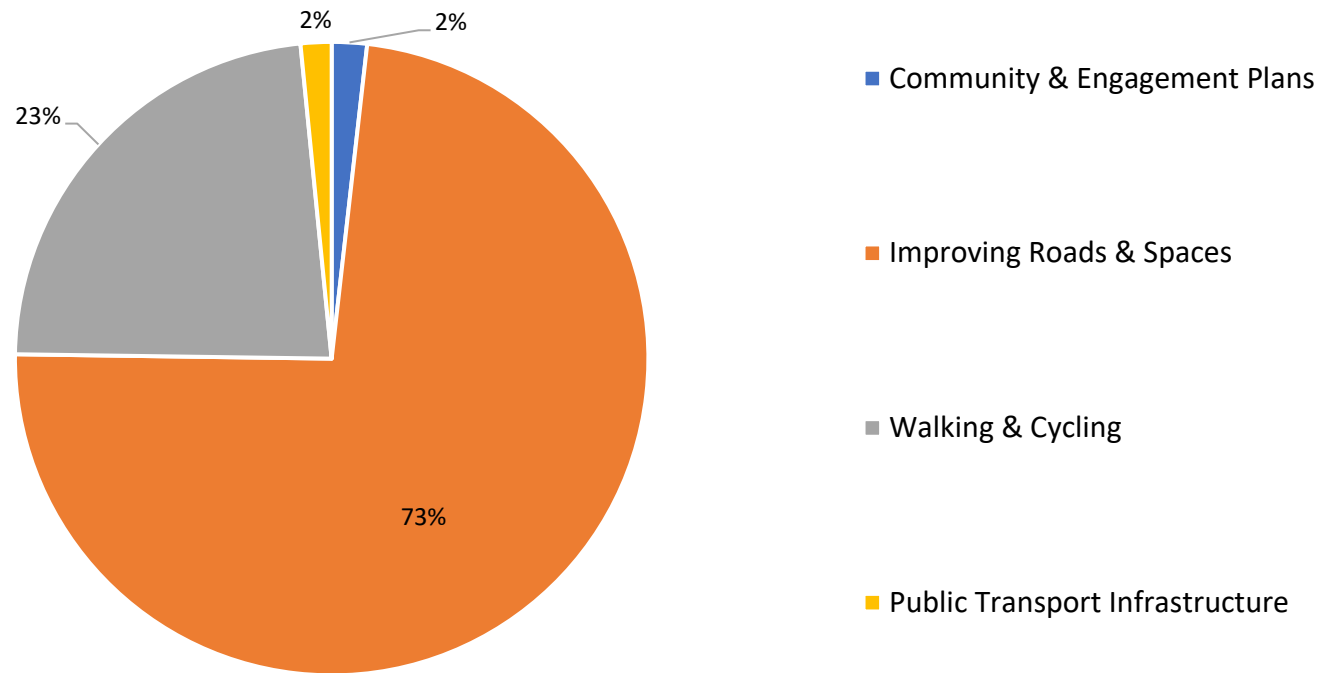
Key things to note:

- this shows the money contributions from developers (S106) for transport improvements in Whitehill and Bordon
- it is held by Hampshire County Council and has been spent or promised for i.e. committed
- total S106 received is all of the S106 money
- total spent is what we have spent in total so far
- total committed is out of all the S106 we received, this is the amount remaining that has been allocated to schemes
- total available is out of all the S106 we received, this is the amount remaining in the funding pot unallocated to schemes yet but will need to be as part of the Transport Plan for the area
- no new S106 money is expected to be available for use until 2030

Committed Schemes June 2026



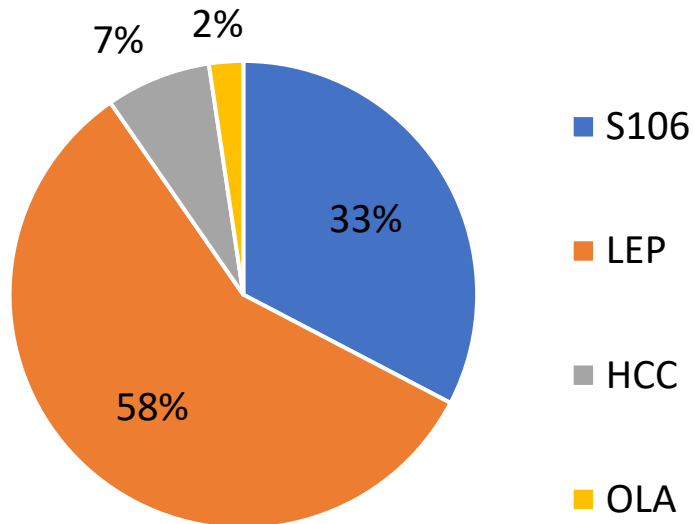
Key things to note:

- these schemes are to make it easier and safer for people to get around Whitehill and Bordon with some being part of future plans proposed in the Transport Strategy

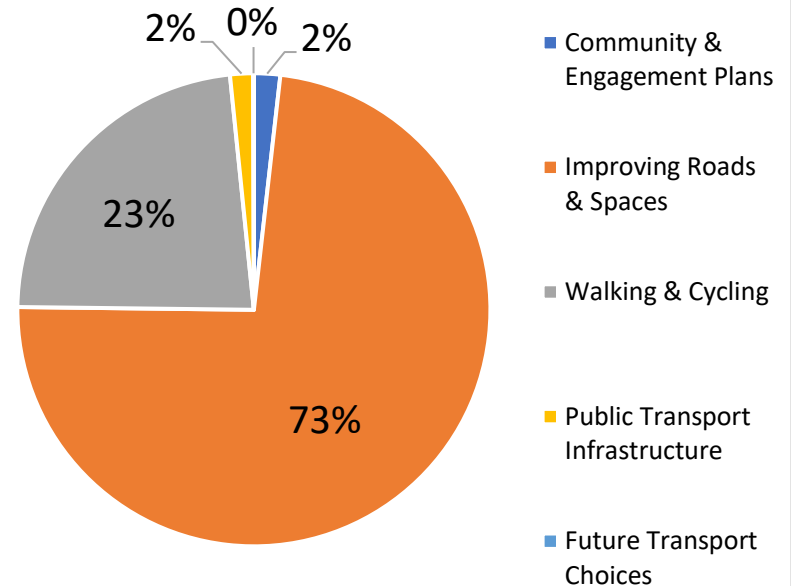

Overall funding - £45m



All Funding Spent by Theme



Key things to note:

- there has been nearly £45 million overall for transport improvements over the years from various funding sources, as well as from S106
- this includes money from the Local Enterprise Zone, and other local authorities which is not S106 money
- these have been across many types of transport schemes, to support Whitehill and Bordon's community

Public Transport Support Budget

In addition to S106 above, HCC have been able to support the following Bus services from the Public Transport Support Budget:

- £145k subsidy p.a. Service 23 Liphook – Bordon – Haslemere
- £20k subsidy p.a. Service 28 - Bordon local Taxishare (bookable shared transport) – funded from S106 funding
- £32k p.a. subsidy into East Hants Connect (formerly Dial-a-Ride) across East Hants

Bus Service Improvement Plan grant funding from the Department for Transport

- Funding has been secured from the Parish Bus Shelter Grant scheme to install 15 new bus shelters in Whitehill and Bordon. This work will be managed by the Town Council.
- Ongoing engagement with Stagecoach to seek RTPI expansion opportunities beyond current 14 stops.
- Since June 2025, HCC have been able to support the following bus timetable service enhancements using Bus Service Improvement Plan. Further funding will enable these to continue until June 2028:
 - Service 18 Whitehill/Bordon – Farnham - Aldershot. Bus frequency doubled to run every 30 minutes on Mondays to Saturdays, and hourly on Sundays.
 - Service 13 Whitehill/Bordon – Alton – Basingstoke has a new Sunday service.
